As the Head of the Household Should Teach in the Simplest Way...

The Catechism is for home use by the head of the household to teach and practice the faith with his children. Parents, and especially the father, are the primary catechists of their children.

The primary texts of Luther's Catechisms are not "Luther's." The primary texts belong to the Church of all times and in all places. They are the most important texts for the Church and they are all taken from the Bible. They answer the practical questions for every Christian: What is God's Law? The _______. What is the Gospel? The ______? How do Christians pray? The ______. How do we become Christians? The Sacrament of ______. How is our faith strengthened? The preaching of ______. What medicine does God give us against the devil, the fallen world, and our sinful nature? The Sacrament of the ______. These texts are not unique to Lutherans. They are Christian and Biblical.

Christians Learn by Doing

Christian catechesis does not only take place in youth catechism class. Catechesis involves "the doing" of those things which will continue to be part of the Christian's life after Baptism: <u>attending the Divine Service</u>, <u>confessing sin, hearing preaching and the absolution, receiving the Lord's body and blood, and living in one's calling</u>. The man's calling includes confessing faith in Christ, loving his wife and children unconditionally, teaching his family the Word of God, praying for them and his neighbors, forgiving the trespasses of those who have sinned against him, suffering for the sake of the Gospel, and contending with his own weakness and failings in the joy and confidence of Christ's forgiveness. All this flows from faith in Christ. Catechesis enables the Christian to live faithfully in that calling by hearing the Word of Christ and doing those very things that will continue to be a part of his life.
