Jesus said: "Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (Matthew 22:21).

"What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits to me?" We sing those words in the offertory. But have you ever thought much about those words? What do you owe God? Do we owe anything to God?

To render to God the things that are God's is to follow the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy," which means that we fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it (Luther's Small Catechism).

Rendering to God the things that are God's is to repent of your sins and to follow God's Son in trusting obedience, since through Christ we receive His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation. Everything we have is a gift from God – our life, our possessions, our families, our children, our health, our wealth. We could never repay Christ for our salvation, but we can say thanks. In the Divine Service, God serves us as we thank Him for sending Jesus as our Savior from sin and eternal death by gladly hearing His Word and learning it. Christ alone destroyed sin's power through His death and resurrection.

So, we say thanks to God by receiving His gifts of Word and Sacrament in the Divine Service. It is here where God delivers His people from the clutches of the devil, He brings His people to Himself, and He keeps His people loyal to Him in faith.

"Oh give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever!" (Psalm 107:1)

The Book of Revelation – Wednesday Morning Bible Study

The Book of Revelation is addressed to seven churches: Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, Laodicea. These seven churches represent the Christian Church for all time and place. When reading through Revelation 2-3, we certainly see that fact. Each congregation was far from perfect, they are sinner-saints after all, as they all dealt with false teachings from within or from without. To each congregation, Jesus spoke to them law to show them their sins and gospel in showing what Christ has won for them. Below are some examples of how we still face the same challenges as the congregations of the past.

- **Ephesus**: Persevering in the midst of suffering, and uncompromising against evil.
- Smyrna: Poor monetarily, but rich in God's grace.
- **Pergamum**: Double-mindedness. Saying that they are Christians but not living the life of faith.
- **Thyatira**: Heresy and seduction.
- Sardis: Going through the motions of religion as Jesus meant little to them.
- **Philadelphia**: Kept the word of Jesus and have not denied His Name.
- Laodicea: Apathetic in their faith in Christ as they found security in their possessions and wealth.

As God's Word says in Ecclesiastes 1:9, "There is nothing new under the sun." We can see ourselves in each of these congregations – for good or bad. But despite their faith or lack thereof, Christ is still present as the ruler of His Church offering the forgiveness of sins that He won for all people through His death and bodily resurrection.

This is just a taste of what the Wednesday Morning Bible Study has learned so far in our study on the Book of Revelation. Please join us each Wednesday at 9:30 a.m.!
