The Singing Church

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

The Latin phrase "lex orandi, lex credendi," which means "the law of prayer is the law of faith" is another way of saying, "You are what you eat." So, the way we worship, shapes how we believe, or the way we sing, shapes our doctrine.

What we sing shapes what we believe and how we live. This was a major critique by the Roman Church of Martin Luther. Luther's critics were saying of the Reformation: "They are singing their way to Luther's doctrines." Well, the Germans were singing, but they weren't singing to "Luther's doctrines," but instead to orthodox Christian doctrine.

From the beginning, the Lutherans were criticized for following Luther. (This is still a critique by many today who confuse Lutheranism with Luther.) This is why, to this day, Lutherans have included the proof text for each part of the Divine Service, as well as the hymns. Lutherans don't follow Luther. Lutherans follow Jesus Christ.

In fact, at first, Luther disliked the idea of a group of Christians being called "Lutherans." The term "Lutheran" was first used by the Roman Church as a derogatory term, but eventually, the title became a term of endearment. Luther never much liked "Lutheran" as he much preferred the term "Evangelical," since they were followers of the Gospel of Christ. In time, Luther approved of "Lutheran," since it became synonymous with orthodox Christian doctrine.

From nearly the start, Lutherans were known as "the singing church." Prior to the Reformation, only the clergy and choirs sang, but Luther urged parishioners to sing since "Next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." With music serving as an important aspect of teaching Christian doctrine, the first Lutheran hymnal was published in 1524 and was known as the "Actliederbuch" (literally: "book with eight hymns"). Imagine just singing eight hymns! I would believe every Lutheran memorized those first Lutheran hymns. Of those original eight hymns, only three have been retained by the Lutheran Service Book. These include two hymns on justification: Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice (LSB 556) by Luther and Salvation Unto Us Has Come (LSB 555) by Paul Speratus. The third is a hymn of confession: From Depths of Woe I Crv to Thee (LSB 607) by Luther, which became Luther's favorite hymn. Today, the LSB contains nearly 700 hymns.

When it comes to Christian catechesis, Luther wrote several hymns including: on the Ten Commandments, These Are the Holy Ten Commands (LSB 581); on the Creed: We All Believe in One True God (LSB 954); on the Lord's Prayer: Our Father, Who from Heaven Above; on Baptism, To Jordan Came the Christ, our Lord (LSB 506); on Confession: From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee (LSB 607); and on the Lord's Supper: O Lord, We Praise Thee (LSB 617).

For sure, Luther taught orthodox Christian doctrine through music. His influence on teaching Christian doctrine through song continues to this very day. God's richest blessings be upon you as we celebrate Reformation 2023!

Prince of Peace Tidings LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF MISSION QUILTS

A new outreach project has started at Prince of Peace. Making Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts is a tangible way to express love to our neighbors in need. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, simple tents or floor coverings. Each one reflects God's loving presence in a world full of suffering. Can't sew? Don't worry there are many ways that you can help out. We are not out buying new materials to make these quilts. Ask a neighbor or friend if they have old cotton top sheets or light blankets they want to get rid of. Garage sales, Goodwill, Good Samaritan or any second-hand store is also a good resource to find these items. Sheets cannot be stained; they will be used for backing and light blankets will be quilt filling. There are also many small ways you can help construct quilts. All materials need to be washed, after washing the material needs to be ironed to make it easier to cut into squares. After squares are cut, they are sewed together to make aa 60 x 80 quilt top. When we a have some quilt tops together, we will have an ingathering. At the ingathering we will put the quilts on a frame to be tied. Quilts are gathered once a year and shipped out. This will be done with other churches in the area that are also quilting.

This is not just for LWML ladies, anyone can join. Have a friend that would like to get together with some ladies for fellowship and a good cause? Invite them to join.

Hope you all can be a part of this worthy project that will be ongoing from year to year if possible.

Ten quilts are finished! The next day to get together is September 18.

There will be a special "blessing of the quilts" during a worship service in October.

<u>Genesis Project School Study</u> <u>Update</u>

Earlier this year, Prince of Peace Lutheran Church voted to partner with the three other LCMS congregations in La Crosse County (Faith, La Crosse;

Shepherd of the Hills, Onalaska; and Gift of Grace, Holmen) to enter into a feasibility study through the Genesis Project for an LCMS parochial school in the area.

The Genesis Project is an initiative of the LCMS, which works to start new schools in the synod. Upon submitting the required preliminary information, the four congregations have been accepted into the program and will be assigned a consultant. The consultant will coach the feasibility study steering committee as we prayerfully consider if a new school is achievable and appropriate in our area.

The primary contact person and the main conduit between the synodical offices and the steering committee is Jim Magnuson, a layman at Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church. Magnuson is the lead on assigning projects and tasks for the committee.

On June 12, the steering committee first met at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. The committee met primarily to put faces to names and answer any preliminary questions.

In the meantime, what can I do? Pray. Prayer is powerful. Pray for the steering committee and pray for proper discernment that the path may be clear on the feasibility of starting a new school. God's will is always done.

Also, the Genesis Project coordinator has asked parishioners from our four area congregations to fill out a simple, anonymous, ten question survey: <u>www.surveymonkey.com/r/JNT2BNN</u>. This survey is being used to get a fuller picture of our congregations' willingness to take on such a task. Even if you do not have young children, please participate in the survey.


