#### Why Should I Come to Church?

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

The Third Commandment states: Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Martin Luther says this about the Third Commandment: We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.

In the Third Commandment, God invites us to rest in Him, reflect on His Word, and receive His forgiveness in order to strengthen our faith in Him.

Remembering the Sabbath day is vital for Christians. We sometimes believe that we can worship God by ourselves. We can do that to an extent. We can see God's creation all around us. But like skipping church, what is missing? His Word and Sacraments.

Gathering for worship in the Divine Service is a time of encouragement with fellow Christians. We share our blessings, our burdens, and joys in petitions and hymns of praise with those present, remembering the Church throughout the world and the saints and angels in heaven.

Each weekend, we all make choices. There is so much we can do. As Jesus says in the Parable of the Great Banquet (Luke 14:12-24), it is only natural that we make excuses when we are all invited to church. It's natural, because of our inherited sinful nature. We naturally think of ourselves. Sinful man is great at making excuses. "Sunday Funday" has become engrained in today's culture. Really, Sunday Funday is nothing new. That is the same excuse that those who declined the invitation to the Great Banquet. We plead necessity: "I have bought a field, and I must go out and see it. Please have me excused." We plead inconvenience: "I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them." We plead pleasure: "I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come." We are great at making excuses.

But, really, what's so important about attending church services? Why can't I just sleep in? Why can't I sit home and watch tv? Why can't I just relax, stay home, watch sports, or just have a day of recreation? Well, they are nothing bad on their own. There is nothing inherently evil about those things. But what is missing? God's Word. Instead of resting in God's Word and Sacraments, those other things that replace church have become false idols of false worship.

So, gathering together with fellow Christians in public worship is vital. It's vital because God is present as His unchanging Word is proclaimed and His Sacraments are administered. Through these Means of Grace, He freely gives His gifts and blessings, chiefly the forgiveness of sins. In the Divine Service, our Shepherd, Jesus, speaks through the mouth of the shepherd (the pastor) whom He has called to care for the souls of the congregation. The Word of God is not simply information, but the Word actually delivers what it says.

Gathering in public worship is also a public testimony to our faith in Christ to the world. Remember, we live in a fallen world. Satan has his grips on the culture around us. It is his culture. Satan uses sinful men to preach tolerance of vice (sin) and intolerance of virtue. Satan uses his culture to convince people to tolerate worldly sins, but to be intolerant of God's unchanging truth. So, by attending the Divine Service, you are testifying that Jesus is your redeemer from sin, eternal death, and the devil.

Lastly, we gather in church in the sure and certain hope that Christ is coming. He is coming at an hour that we do not expect. So, the way to be ready for His coming is receive His free gift of His medicine of immorality in His Word and Sacrament. By receiving His gifts, we know that we have nothing to fear on the day of His coming.

So, come, but not only come! Invite others, since God's gifts are for everyone! Everything is ready!

Along with God's Word, prayer is yet one more gift to help us stay connected to Jesus and to one another.

### LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF MISSION QUILTS

A new outreach project has started at Prince of Peace. Making Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts is a tangible way to express love to our neighbors in need. Quilts can be used as warm bedding, simple tents or floor coverings. Each one reflects God's loving presence in a world full of suffering. Can't sew? Don't worry there are many ways that you can help out. We are not out buying new materials to make these quilts. Ask a neighbor or friend if they have old cotton top sheets or light blankets they want to get rid of. Garage sales, Goodwill, Good Samaritan or any second-hand store is also a good resource to find these items. Sheets cannot be stained; they will be used for backing and light blankets will be quilt filling. There are also many small ways you can help construct quilts. All materials need to be washed, after washing the material needs to be ironed to make it easier to cut into squares. After squares are cut, they are sewed together to make aa 60 x 80 quilt top. When we a have some quilt tops together, we will have an ingathering. At the ingathering we will put the quilts on a frame to be tied. Quilts are gathered once a year and shipped out. This will be done with other churches in the area that are also quilting.

This is not just for LWML ladies, anyone can join. Have a friend that would like to get together with some ladies for fellowship and a good cause? Invite them to join.

Hope you all can be a part of this worthy project that will be ongoing from year to year if possible.

Ten quilts are finished! The next day to get together is September 18.

There will be a special "blessing of the quilts" during a worship service in October.

# **Genesis Project School Study Update**

Earlier this year, Prince of Peace Lutheran Church voted to partner with the three other LCMS congregations in La Crosse County (Faith, La Crosse; Shepherd of the Hills, Onalaska; and Gift of Grace, Holmen) to enter into a feasibility study through the Genesis Project for an LCMS parochial school in the area.

The Genesis Project is an initiative of the LCMS, which works to start new schools in the synod. Upon submitting the required preliminary information, the four congregations have been accepted into the program and will be assigned a consultant. The consultant will coach the feasibility study steering committee as we prayerfully consider if a new school is achievable and appropriate in our area.

The primary contact person and the main conduit between the synodical offices and the steering committee is Jim Magnuson, a layman at Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church. Magnuson is the lead on assigning projects and tasks for the committee.

On June 12, the steering committee first met at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. The committee met primarily to put faces to names and answer any preliminary questions.

In the meantime, what can I do? Pray. Prayer is powerful. Pray for the steering committee and pray for proper discernment that the path may be clear on the feasibility of starting a new school. God's will is always done.

Also, the Genesis Project coordinator has asked parishioners from our four area congregations to fill out a simple, anonymous, ten question survey: <a href="https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/JNT2BNN">www.surveymonkey.com/r/JNT2BNN</a>. This survey is being used to get a fuller picture of our congregations' willingness to take on such a task. Even if you do not have young children, please participate in the survey.

An old story about a woman who lived on an island in the Pacific illustrates what it means to live like you're loved. Serita, described by all her neighbors as plain, even homely, walked with shoulders slumped and head bowed. She rarely looked anyone in the eye, seldom laughed in public.

One day a man named Johnny came to ask for Serita's hand in marriage and offered eight cows for the privilege of marrying her. The girl's father sat stunned—no one on the island had ever offered more than five or six cows as a bride price. He immediately accepted the offer before Johnny could change his mind.

Everyone on the island thought Johnny had gone mad. Who would be foolish enough to pay eight cows for a wife—let alone a plain one like Serita? After the wedding, Johnny took Serita back to his home on a neighboring island. The people on Serita's island continued to laugh at Johnny's madness, but no longer saw the newlyweds.

### Transformed by Love

One day a visitor who had heard of the story of the eight-cow wife came to Johnny's home. Johnny invited him in and as they talked a lovely, graceful woman passed through the room. The visitor thought he had never seen such a beautiful woman. He asked Johnny, "Who was that?"

Seeing the surprise on his visitor's face, Johnny explained that on her home island, Serita felt she had no value. But since Johnny paid the eight-cow price, she now knew she was worth more than any other woman on the islands. And that realization changed her from the inside out.

# When We Live Like We're Loved We are Changed

At times, we too, feel like Serita. We feel insignificant in the eyes of the world. We consider ourselves homely and plain, inferior and worthless. We start to believe the lies of Satan, that no one could ever love us. We accept the world's judgment that we don't matter.

But everything changes when we realize that Jesus paid the highest price possible for us. It's true we were nothing much to talk about when He found us. We were stained by sin, stooped over by shame and He could have walked right by us. But instead, Jesus chose us. He paid more than eight cows. Christ paid the exorbitant price of His own life to redeem us and make us His own. His
