<u>Background:</u>
Thomas Rhett studied business and communications at Lipscomb University in Nashville. This song came from one night in college where he was studying for a test. Thomas recalled: "I had been drinking a lot of caffeine and my brain was just racing. I had all these sticky notes lying around with song titles instead of studying. I just thought how it would be cool to sit talk to Jesus and be able to ask Him any question I wanted."

Rhett explains the meaning of the song: "If Jesus was here today walking in the flesh like He was, back when He was here, I'd probably take him down to the Flying Saucer (in Nashville) and order up a Newcastle and just pick His brain about life," he said, "ask Him if I'm doing alright, ask Him how some of the people in my life that are close to me that have died, how they're doing in Heaven. So, it's just a really personal song to me."

"Tell the waitress put 'em on my tab." Do you think Jesus would have someone pay for his drink? (Isaiah 55:1)

"Careful when I got the chance to ask." Should we wait for the "right time" to ask Jesus questions? (Luke 8:40-56)

"How'd you turn the other cheek?" (Matthew 5:38-42; Matthew 27:27-31)

In Matthew 5, Jesus speaks of a totally different attitude for His disciples, one He practiced: turning the other cheek. In turning the other cheek, Jesus is describing a person who is facing persecution. The slap is more of an insult than an attempt to do physical harm. He illustrated this nonresistance with four examples: slapping of the cheeks, tunic and cloak, walking two miles instead of one mile, begging and borrowing.

In Matthew 27, Jesus is mocked as a false king by the Roman soldiers. They despise His weakness, but it is the way that He would win His kingdom – He would redeem the world and win His subjects on the cross.

No one can live a holy life, except for Jesus. We are far away from the perfection that the Law requires.

Types of Prayer:

Lamentation – we express our complaints and sorrows to God (Psalm 10)

Praise – we extol God's wonderful deeds and qualities (Psalm 136)

A human is made up of body and soul (Matthew 10:28). When a human dies, his soul is separated from his body. His body decays, but his soul lives on. If a person trusts in Jesus for salvation, his soul will live in joy with God, awaiting the resurrection, the last judgment, and eternal life. If a person is wicked and unbelieving, his soul will live in torment, awaiting the resurrection, the last judgment, and eternal condemnation.
