INTROIT (front page)

MEDITATION: Psalm 145. The 145th psalm is a psalm of thanks for the kingdom of Christ, which was to come. It strongly urges the high, exalted work of praising God and glorifying His power and kingdom. For Christ's kingdom and power are hidden under the cross. If the cross were not extolled through preaching, teaching, and confession, who could have ever thought of it, to say nothing of knowing it? But such is His Kingdom and power, that He aided the fallen, called the needy to Himself, made sinners godly, and brought the dead to life. Yes, He is the one who gives food to all, who hears the call of His saints, does what they desire, and protects them. *Prayer:* Praise to the Lord! O let all that is in me adore Him!
