INVOCATION

INTROIT (front page)

MEDITATION: Psalm 22. The 22nd psalm is a prophecy of the suffering and resurrection of Christ and a prophecy of the Gospel, which the entire world shall hear and receive. Beyond all other texts, it clearly shows Christ's torment on the cross, that He was pierced hand and foot and His limbs stretched out so that His bones could have been counted. Nowhere in the other prophets can one find so clear a description. It is indeed one of the chief psalms. Prayer: Merciful and kind are You, O Lord of hosts, because You have sent the Gospel of Your Son to us Gentiles. Our fathers went to worship idols as they were led, but to us, their children, You have sent the light, though we deserved it not.
