MEDITATION: Psalm 81. The 81st psalm is a psalm of prayer. It is a song sung and preached in the harvest season at the Festival of Tabernacles, calling the people back to the First Commandment, that they should have only one God—He who had brought them out of the land of Egypt—and should praise and call on no other...This psalm teaches us to believe in Christ and cling to Him alone and never commend any work as righteous before God. We also should have our mouth full of Christ... *Prayer:* O Lord, God of all grace, anoint us with the oil of joy, causing Your Holy Spirit to dwell in our hearts, that He may teach us to worship You in spirit and in truth.
